Easy Crochet Shawl Pattern

This beginner shawl pattern was found on FaveCrafts.com. It's a simple rectangle that uses double crochet and chain stitches. This pattern was written for a super bulky yarn, 79% acrylic and 21% polyester. Other bulky yarns can be substituted OR be brave and use other weights. In any case, you should crochet a gauge swatch and do a little math. The finished size is what's important.

Crochet Hook J-10 or 6 mm hook (if you're using a chunky

yarn)

Yarn Weight Bulky/Chunky (12-15 stitches for 4 inches), or

other depending on weight

Crochet Gauge Double Crochet (dc), Chain 1 (ch 1), dc = 1'', 3

rows = $2\frac{1}{2}$ "

Finished Size Approximately 24" x 60" not including fringe

Materials List The pattern was originally written for Caron

Cozi (company defunct). You'll need about 360 yds

Size J crochet hook or size to reach gauge below. Keep in mind that if you use a lighter weight yarn you'll need to adjust your hook

size.



Do Not add Fringe for Prayer Shawls

Crochet Abbreviations:

Ch or ch Chain

Dc or dc Double Crochet

Sk or sk Skip

Instructions

Keep in mind that you should always begin with a gauge swatch and be sure to convert yardage for any substitute yarn. Yarn usage may vary depending on your particular yarn techniques.

Begin by chaining (Ch) 59

Row 1: Dc in 3rd ch from hook and in ea ch across. (57 dc)

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as 1 dc throughout) dc in next dc, * ch 1, sk 1 dc, dc in next dc, * rep from * across

until last 3 stitches, ch 1, sk 1 dc, dc in next dc, dc in top of ch 3 stitch.

Row 3: Ch 3, dc in next dc, * ch 1, sk ch 1 sp, dc in next dc, * rep between * across until last 3 stitch-

es, ch 1, sk ch 1 sp, dc in last 2 dc. Rep Row 3 until wrap measures approximately 60" or wrap

measures from wrist to wrist.
