What Hosting Means to 1st Pres

Hosting a meal means you will eat with the guests but not, necessarily, provide the food. Judy Flieger still has one night of dinner hosting left to fill.

Overnight hosting means you can eat with the guests and dinner hosts at 5:30 pm or simply relieve the dinner hosts at 7:00 pm. You sleep at the church (Calvary Lutheran) and have important coordinators and FPNI staff member numbers in case of an emergency. Overnight hosts get up early, prepare coffee and make sure the guests are awake at their proper time. Usually duties are done by 7:00 am. Judy has filled all overnight host spots.

Those who prepare meals can make the entree, salad, and dessert (full meal deal) or get together with friends and divide meal prep. Sometimes the dinner preparer also chooses to be dinner host the same night. Teri has scheduled all meals for July 4-10.

Providing breakfast or lunch. This round at Calvary Lutheran, Bill Burch will be purchasing breakfast and lunch items with money donated to our Family Promise NI coordinator's fund. Next hosting time Bill will be contacting people or you can contact him. Email: <u>Bill Burch</u>

I find it hard to believe that it has been more than 20 years since Jimmy Robnet came to Middlers youth group and told me we had to go to a special talk that night. A couple phone calls later, we had drivers and were on our way. That night, I met Jeff Cheeseborough of Juvenile Justice Outreach, and First Presbyterian Downtown has been a Mission partner supporting their work ever since. I'm sorry to say that Jeff passed away last year and will be greatly missed. The reins of JJO have since been turned over to a very dedicated Jackson Lanterman.

I met with Jackson this past February about JJO. Their goal is to meet the physical and spiritual needs of at-risk kids in our community. There are approximately 300 youth in the CdA and Post Falls area on probation, and another 200 youth on diversion at any one time. JJO has set up programs to help these youth change their path in life. Among these programs are: Equine therapy, First Tee, Idaho Youth Challenge, Girls Circle and Angler's Art. Right now, the greatest need is for volunteer mentors. If you (or someone you know) may have an interest in joining their Mission to help Youth in our community, you would be welcome!
